Hello Glenn & Tage,

I wanted to reach out to let you both know that our club has come to an agreement (not formally signed just yet but we have agreed to terms) on leasing a 752sq ft space at the Westbrook Community Center beginning Sept 1st. The cost of this will be ~\$9000 annually which we plan to support through dues, donations and fundraising. We've been extremely successful in managing our operations 90% off fundraising but now I'd like to pivot some of that towards donations and grants. Specifically I'd like to ask for support from the NMRA Seacoast from the Chip Faulter fund, as our layout will serve as a primary outreach tool within not just the Westbrook Community Center, but the entire region, as we intend to have regularly open times where the public can visit and see trains operating.

Since you both are already familiar with the Community Center as a facility this room, which is available in the front of the building, will be 100% dedicated to our group and have our layout setup at all times. Since the space is more than

enough for the size of our current layout, we will also be expanding that, as well as building out a work bench for painting & model repairs, an area to host clinics, a DCC programming computer & track, ect.

The beauty of the Community Center is that it has its own facilities, security, maintenance/cleaning crews, ect as well as an entire other community of non-profit neighbors by which we can learn and collaborate. There are so many events and programs as well, that we will be launching our own outreach programs designed to build the interest in the hobby to the next generation. Ultimately, I believe that this falls under the mission of the Faulter Fund by promoting the hobby to younger generations by simply having our layout setup and available to the general public at the WCC.

Our club, again as you know from our relationship with the Seacoast Division, is extremely well equipped in terms of talent and energy, but also now we have taken in several collections (some rather massive ones actually) so we are also resource rich. This will certainly over time help with the funding of the space, but also allow us to build out our layout on a lower cost. We also know that finally having an established space will accelerate membership growth of our club, which further bolsters the sustainability of the fundraising and other efforts such as expanding our Train Show offering to a bi-annual (Fall and Spring) event.

Please let me know your thoughts on this request and I'm happy to speak with you further. Also, with a permanent operating layout the Seacoast Winter event will have access to our room and layout to host a true operating session if you so like.

Last request-- please do not publicize this yet, as we haven't signed the lease just yet. I do have a written agreement but again holding the exciting news until its 'officially official'. You may share within the Seacoast general officers to discuss our request but we will make it public very soon.
