
# Model Railroading Night in Derry





the committee what they've done and the committee will get things rolling.



May 11<sup>th</sup> 2012, Jerry Kelley will be giving a presentation, "Hoosac Tunnel Lining Towers" (<a href="http://www.jkrails.net">http://www.jkrails.net</a>). Jerry Kelley has been hiking the hills around the Hoosac Tunnel in Western Massachusetts for years searching for long forgotten places of historical interest. He has tried to bring to light the facts that have been previously overlooked. His talk will center on the survey of the Hoosac Tunnel and the methods used to bring the six headings together with amazing accuracy, even by today's standards. He will start with a brief 1928 film of a Hoosac electric locomotive and it's journey through the Eastern and Western portals. The PowerPoint presentation will outline each survey tower location as it looks today with photos and story, some with photos from the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Jerry will have on hand his Hoosac model collection for all to see. The end of the show will feature a question and answer session on the tunnel and it's history.

## Candidate Profile: Tom Jones

My name is Tom Jones and I go by the nickname "tj". Like most of us I have been interested in trains for a very long time. In college in Colorado I became fascinated with the mining town of Cripple Creek and took many trips up the "Gold Camp Road" which was built at the turn of the 19<sup>th</sup> century as a short line railroad between the gold mining towns of Cripple Creek and Victor and Colorado Springs. I built a small N-scale layout on a 3'x 5 'piece of plywood and transported it to several different duty stations while I pursued my career as a U.S. Navy Pilot. But it didn't survive and train interest was put aside until the early 1990's as I approached retirement. An advertisement for the Valley Forge National Train show in 1993 led me to attending the event and I was again hooked. I joined the NMRA shortly after and have been a member playing with trains ever since. My current layout "The Wyoming & Western" has finally taken over my entire basement (although my wife fought valiantly for the space for several years.)

I have actively supported the NMRA and it's oversight of our modeling community. I have attended 9 National and 5 regional conventions. I volunteered at the last 2 Seacoast sponsored regional conventions and presented clinics at both. I was also fortunate to get my feet wet at the National level by participating as an NMRA Achievement Program contest judge at the 2011 national convention in Sacramento California

## **Minutes**

#### Seacoast Board of Directors Meeting June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2011

The Northeast Region, Seacoast Division Board of Directors met Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup> 2011 at Board of Director Rich Breton's home in Rochester New Hampshire. In addition to Rich meeting attendees were Seacoast President Bruce Robinson, Director and Seacoast Treasurer Tom Coulombe, Director and Secretary Tom Jones, and Directors Larry Cannon, Michael Grahame and Erich Whitney. In addition Ken May the Northeast Region's convention chairman was invited and traveled 3 hours to discuss the Seacoast Division's 2013 convention bid preparations.

Prior to Ken's arrival the board discussed the state of division finances, which stand at \$1755. Discussion of how to generate income for support of membership activities was discussed and it was pointed out that the major source of our income has been the money generated from raffle sales at the division-sponsored conventions. 2002 in Portland Me., and 2005 in Nashua New Hampshire were the previous Seacoast sponsored conventions. Treasurer Tom Coulombe pointed out that the Division has very few reoccurring expenses and we were in good financial shape.

Tom Jones updated the status of the new modular group. There has been very little activity within the group since the April meeting at which time standards were approved. Spring and summer has bitten into train time and it will be later in the summer when the group will attempt to get together for some module building work sessions. Michael Grahame and Tom Jones both have work-

shop spaces that can accommodate work sessions. This works out well as Tom lives in Maine and Michael in New Hampshire. This will make it easier for traveling. It is hoped to have some show and tell by the fall Seacoast meeting. Several of the group is planning on attending the NER convention this fall in Rhode Island and networking with other "Free-Mo" based modular groups from other NER divisions.

Erich Whitney updated the status of the new website. He has been working with the NER to get the division under the umbrella of a regional website for the past couple of months. Work is going well and we should be up and running in the near future. Erich has been working closely with the Division's Webmaster, Rob Carrigan and member Chris Baughman on the setup of the new site.

The main agenda item was 2013 convention planning progress. President Robinson and Rich Breton visited a convention complex on lake Winnepsaukee in New Hampshire and were very impressed with the facility and the Hotel's desire to support our convention needs. The area has an abundance of train as well as general tourist activities and should be a good fit for the proposed convention. The Hotel made an initial proposal in writing which Bruce and Rich presented to Ken May. Rich Breton also had an extensive slide show of the facility and surrounding activities that he presented. Ken was pleased with the initial information and has given President Robinson the go ahead to negotiate with the facility and then Ken will make take the proposal to the next NER Board of Directors meeting, hopefully the end of July.

A very productive meeting was concluded with a great lunch of dogs, chips, salad, and sodas provided by the Bretons.

Paul Lessard had a presentation on "Modeling He showed Economically". where he had taken several inexpensive plasticville structures and upgraded them with bits of styrene and parts from craft stores and his parts box. Gordon Draper had two of his Free-mo modules on display for the meeting and talked about how he constructed them and how he was planning the track work. Reports were accepted by vote of the members present. Bruce Robertson then presented the news items from the latest NMRA headquarters info net emailing. Highlighted was an upcoming 2012 dues increase; the presentation of a possible 2016 national convention cruise and a statement about NMRA membership holding steady for the past several quarters around the 195 thousand number

Under old business, Rich Breton our NER representative updated the group on the annual meeting held at the Warwick convention. Because of a change in editors there will be no 4th quarter issue of the Coupler. Rich reported that there were 21 models judged at the convention, which was very good, but very few locomotives. There were 163 attendees at the Warwick convention and the dates of the next couple conventions were firmed up. Next year the convention is in Syracuse NY 6-9 Sept 2012 followed by our convention in Laconia NH 17-20 Oct 2013. The 2014 convention is still considering Palmer MA but there are issues with facilities and available lodging. The Edaville 2012 Scout Jamboree was announced being the 18 and 19<sup>th</sup> of May 2012.

Larry Cannon, Rich Breton, and Holly and Erich Whitney have stepped up to chair our 2013 regional convention. We are looking for a name for the convention with several bantered about. Two suggestions that got some interest were:" Express" Lake side and "Trackside at the Lake" (the most popular choice vocalized). Let us know if you have a suggestion. Our quarterly meeting dates were finalized for next year. Jan7, 2012 Portland Me, April 14<sup>th</sup> Rochester NH, July 14 Auburn ME and Oct 13 Derry NH.

Three Seacoast Directors will come up for election at the January meeting. They are Neil Falby, Rich Breton and Tom Jones. They are all standing for reelection. Any other nominations may be made at the January meeting prior to the vote.
