The Chip Faulter Fund has a balance of \$9663.85 after making a \$1000.00 donation to a church youth group that is building a modular layout in Maine. We continue to look for worthy recipients of funding from the Faulter Fund. Our 2024 NER Convention Exploratory Committee continues to look for an appropriate venue for the convention. Portsmouth and Laconia are the primary areas of interest at this time. I recently sent out a request for volunteers to help with the convention. I thank all of you that have volunteered. The email contained a "strawman" list of positions that needed filling. The convention chairmen roles are well defined in the NER Convention handbook, but the rest of positions were made up by me based on what I know and have observed at other conventions. Given that, I hope that you will not get too concerned about the specific positions listed on the chart. I am sure the specific needs might change and everything will be dependent of the final choice for a venue. At this time I ask all of you this question: "Are you willing to help with the convention?" I hope many more of you can answer YES and volunteer. We will sort out the roles and positions so that every volunteer feels comfortable with the job that they take on.

## Winter Event and Annual Meeting

All NMRA members and people interested in becoming NMRA members are invited to the Winter Event of the Seacoast Division NMRA.

#### We Will Be In Person As Well As On-Line With Zoom

The Seacoast Division Winter 2023 Event and Annual Meeting will be held in person and also on-line with ZOOM at the Westbrook Community Center in Westbrook Maine beginning at 10:00 am. There is ample parking on-site.

Zoom is one of several video conferencing applications available for use on your computer that is connected to the internet. For several years, lap top computers have been equipped with a camera that faces the user, a microphone, and speakers. The computer with the camera/microphone /speaker combination lets the user take advantage of the full capability of Zoom. If you don't have a computer with the camera/microphone /speaker you can still use your computer to view the event and you can communicate with everyone using a phone. Finally, a smart-phone can also be used to participate in a Zoom video conference.

New users will have to go to zoom.us and then download "Zoom Client for Meetings" if you use a computer, or download the Zoom Mobile apps for IPhone or Android from the APP store. You will not have to register for an account. The host of the Zoom Meeting, in our case Seacoast President Tage Erickson, will send out an email with a meeting invitation which includes a link to the meeting. The non-host attendees will click on the link a few minutes prior to the meeting to get connected to the Zoom meeting. The host will then accept you into the meeting and you will be able to see all the attendees that have cameras and you will be able to hear all the attendees that have microphones or have called in on the telephone.

#### Rob Selberg's St. James Sub (N)

The Port Asbestos Terminal "St. James Sub" is an 8x12 N scale layout built for operation, small trains but plenty of action! The layout is based "somewhere" in the northeast and was once a connection between the Canadian pacific and Conrail (now CSX). The layout can support 5 operator with none of them bumping into each other. The layout boasts an active port with car float operation, a midsized paper mill, a local town switch job, a yard switcher and a road job (running trains to the port and back and the mill and back).

After the Event Rob Selberg is hosting a tour of his layout.



## Mt Washington Cog Railway By Tom Oxnard


This fall Sally and I and friends went north to see some foliage and to take the Cog Railway up Mt Washington. It is a three mile climb to the top from 2700ft to 6288ft with an average grade of 25% and a steepest grade of 37% on the Jacob's Ladder trestle. There are three diesels and coaches that take 45 minutes to ascend each hour. Half way up there is an 1800ft passing track where you pass the three diesels and coaches that are descending. All of the diesels were designed and built on-site in their shops starting in 2008. Much of the track and cog are on low trestles, and open so the snow and ice will fall through. The switches are electric and hydraulically powered. Maximum speed is kept at 5 mph.

You get to spend an hour at the top with incredible views and a nice museum. We were lucky and had a beautiful day for Mt Washington's standards.


