







In this video, the system grain train returns to Avery, Idaho, where it will receive a crew change and then continue on its system journey.





Moreover, the Division Business Car name would better acknowledge that most featured items were now coming from Division rather than Region publications. But the most important change was yet to come.

It all began 27 years ago when the NMRA Magazine was known as the NMRA Bulletin. Editor Terry Bacus, Jr. asked me if I would be interested in writing a bi-monthly column called "Region Roundup," highlighting activities at the Region level gleaned from Region news-letters. For various reasons, the bi-monthly idea never got going until 2003, and with only a few rare exceptions, it's been bimonthly ever since. provide lengthy instructions so you could find the Regions, Divisions, and, by then, 100% NMRA Member clubs online. But that all changed when Chuck Diljak, MMR<sup>®</sup>, contacted me in late 2010 with a great idea.
