




All About Boxcars - Part 2


















Replacing a Tsunami with a LokSound!

This model is new enough to have come from the factory with a SoundTraxx Tsunami 2 sound decoder, but old enough to have bulbs for lights.

Since Daniel Cortopassi has standardized on Loksound DCC and sound decoders for all his model train locomotives, he wanted to replace the Tsunami in this engine.


Another goal is to replace the bulbs with LEDs and to make some of the model's non-working lights operational.




The NMRA Achievement Program

The <u>NMRA Achievement Program</u> (AP) is a guide to help you on your journey through the world of model railroading. The AP provides incentive to learn and master the many crafts and skills necessary in the hobby of model railroading. With the mastery of each skill, you will be issued a certificate acknowledging your achievement. There are three groups of awards within the AP - the Golden Spike Award, the AP Certificates program, and the Master Model Railroader® Award. All awards earned in the Achievement Program are recognized in the NMRA Magazine.

Getting involved in the AP is incredibly easy - you just decide to do it! If you are not yet involved, to start you off on the right foot we suggest you contact your local division AP manager. Most divisions list that person in their contact list. Model Contests and Display Areas

NMRA Model Contest

As part of a National Convention, *STATION No. VI* will be hosting the annual *NMRA Model Contest* in the St. Clair conference room for those that wish to enter a model into this contest. Detailed information and room schedule is on our NMRA Model Contest page.

STATION No. VI Model Display Area

If you would like to display a model, but are not interested in getting it judged for an NMRA award or points, we've got you covered at **STATION No. V!** In Ballroom C, we'll have several model railroads displays/operating *plus* many tables for model displays. There will be several different categories, so your model will need to be placed at the proper table.

People's Choice Model Contest

If you're displaying your model in the **Model Display Area** in Ballroom C, you can fill out a form and your model will be entered into the *People's Choice Model Contest*. The convention attendees will get to vote on their favorite models in each category. Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each category, plus the 1st and 2nd place winners will receive gift certificates of **\$100 (1st)** and **\$50 (2nd)** from the sponsor of that category. Yes, we're getting manufacturer sponsors for each category and they will give out these certificates to the winners!

Models will need to be brought to the room on Tuesday and picked up on Friday evening! *People's Choice Model Contest* winners will be announced at the Friday Night Pizza Party. There is no additional charge to bring in and display a model and you can display as many as you wish! The one and only restriction: you cannot enter the *People's Choice Model Contest* and the *NMRA Model Contest* with the same model. You must choose one or the other for your model. You can enter different models in each contest if you wish (a locomotive in the *NMRA Model Contest* and a different locomotive in the *People's Choice Model Contest* is OK to do!).

Activities within the NMRA Model & Photo Contest room (**St. Clair conference room**) will be conducted during the following timeframes. The only exception is The NMRA Model Contest Clinic, which will be conducted in one of the clinic rooms, per details defined in the convention timetable.

Monday, July 14

1pm to 6pm - St. Clair conference room - Model and photo entry.

Tuesday, July 15

9am to 11:30am – St. Clair conference room – Model and photo entry. All contest entries must be received by 11:30am!

1pm to 2pm – Model evaluation clinic (check the Agenda for the clinic location).
2pm to 6pm – St. Clair conference room – Contest model and photo evaluation.

Wednesday, July 16

9am to Noon – St. Clair conference room – Model viewing, score sheet review, and *Meet the Model Builder* (contest participants discussing their modeling techniques with interested attendees)

1pm to 4pm – St. Clair conference room – *NMRA Magazine* model photographs (room closed to attendees).

4pm to 7pm – St. Clair conference room – Model and photo retrieval. <u>All contest room entries must be picked up by 7pm!</u>

Thursday, July 17

10am to 11am – St. Clair conference room – Awards presentation.

NMRA Model & Photo Contests

We encourage all folks interested in the NMRA's achievement program to bring models and photos to the *NMRA Model & Photo Contests*. Merit awards, place awards, and manufacturer-sponsored awards will be presented to participants. Model evaluators and contest staff will be available throughout the week to assist modelers in building better models, from construction to detailing, painting, weathering, and prototype conformance.

In addition to your models, you'll need a couple of forms to accompany each item. One form is for modeler entry information (Form 901) and the second, for model description and evaluation (Form

902). Both forms are available on the NMRA website (**www.nmra.org/education**), along with information of how your models will be evaluated. **NOTE**: The NMRA Photo Contest only uses a **Form 901** for each photo entered, **NOT** a Form 902!

Much of that information will be reiterated at the convention during a Tuesday afternoon clinic. All those participating in the NMRA model contest, from those entering models to those evaluating them, are encouraged to attend this presentation and discussion. Check the <u>Agenda</u> for the clinic time and place.

Contest staff will also be available throughout the week to assist those participating in the achievement program and interested only in Merit Award evaluation and documentation completion for their models

NMRA Contest Forms - Entry Form 901, Model Contest Scoring Sheet Form 902

Note that <u>only</u> the NMRA Model Contest requires the additional Form 902 for scoring purposes. All other NMRA contests Photo, Arts & Crafts, Railroad Pass, etc., only require an Entrant Form 901 for each entry in the NMRA Contest.

Sample of a Railroad Pass

Definition - Competitive event for entrant-made railroad passes: all entries are judged by a team of experienced judges using a simple ranking system.

Additional Requirements - In addition to the general requirements listed under General Contest information the following also apply.

Two (2) entries are required for each pass in order to show both sides of each pass entered.

Any type of railroad pass is eligible in the form of a business card of flash card size. All other forms, letters, documents, stock certificates, etc. will not be allowed and will only be accepted as display-only (non-contest) entries.

A Contest Entry Form #901 will need to be filled out for each entry.

NMRA Judged Photo Contest

Definition - Competitive event for photographs: all entries are judged by a team of experienced judges using a ranking system that is explained in the **National Photo Contest Judging Guidelines**.

Additional Requirements - In addition to the general requirements listed under the General Contest information the following also apply.

Photos produced using either film or digital cameras are permitted.

Each entrant shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) entries with a maximum of five (5) entries in one category. A Contest Entry Form #901 will need to be filled out for each entry.

Prints shall be mounted on flat, rigid board or matted with similar material. No folders or glass frames are allowed. Photo and mount shall not exceed 12" x 16" (30cm x 40cm) in size. Minimum mount size is 8" x 10" (20cm x 25cm) and minimum print size is 5" x 7" (13cm x 18cm).

A Panorama print photograph will be defined as any photo whose width exceeds the dimensions listed above by a factor of two, three, or four (such as 5" x 14", 5" x 21", 5" x 28") and is limited in height to 8".

Prints shall have entrant's name on the <u>back</u>. Prints may be titled on the front. Prints with entrant's name on the front will not be accepted.

Exposure of the original photo must have been made by the entrant and cannot have won a first place at any previous National Convention.

Categories - Each entry shall be placed in one of the following categories:

- a. Model Black & White Print
- c. Prototype Black & White
- e. Working on the Railroad

- b. Model Color Print
- d. Prototype Color
- f. Panorama Print

g. Display Only - Not to be judged


