The idea of finding happiness with a large unachievable model railroad is extremely rare. Everyone thinks they are the exception when in fact most are the rule. Large layout nirvana is a myth perpetuated by the idea that a new locomotive will somehow solve the problem. In retrospect, it was the inevitable poorly planned and overly ambitious idea that killed the layout concept before it ever had a chance to become a reality.

In former cases, the only way to invigorate or sustain interest in a poorly planned, and overwhelming layout, is to keep buying trains to sustain a fleeting interest that is headed to inevitable burn out and overwhelming procrastination - only to repeat the same process - over - and - over again. The only solution in many cases is to re-plan and start again - unfortunately. In most cases, you will be glad you did because we all go through it.

This video demonstrates how the above dilemma was overcome. A smaller layout offers all the same benefits as a large layout on a more intimate footprint. They don't overwhelm the builder and also help to achieve success and confidence based on achievable goals. The rewards come sooner, rather than later, and can be quite remarkable.


Ipswich Hobbies is a small company that focuses on delivering laser cut craftsman building kits that are based upon prototype structures.
